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ENTRY FEE: \$20 per golfer for greens fees, range balls, and please pay with a check or credit card to pay the golf course directly on the day of the tournament.

RANGE BALLS: A small bucket of range balls

DISTRICT QUALIFIERS: (2A)

Boys finishing in places 7-15 will qualify for the district tournament at Gold Mountain on May 16th. Top (6) spots qualify for WIAA state.

(1A)

Boys finishing in places 1-9 will qualify for the district tournament at Gold Mountain on May 16th.

(2A)

Girls finishing in places 5-13 will qualify for the district tournament at Gold Mountain on May 16th. Top (4) spots qualify for WIAA state.

(1A)

Girls finishing in places 1-3 will qualify for the district tournament at Gold Mountain on May 16th.

STATE QUALIFIERS: (2A only)

The top (6) seven boys will gain automatic berths to WIAA State from the OL League Tournament.

The top (4) five girls will gain automatic berths to WIAA State from the OL League Tournament.

<p>OLYMPIC LEAGUE GOLF TOURNAMENT W.I.A.A. GUIDELINES</p>

RULES:

*Range Finders will be allowed for use during league play and any hosted non-league matches (Non-League Matches at other sites may be up to the rules of the Host League). Devices that calculate slope, wind speed, temperature, etc... in addition to yardage are NOT permitted. Use of devices that calculate slope, wind speed, temperature, etc... will result in disqualification of any player that utilized the device or the information. GPS Devices, GPS cell phone apps and GPS watches are NOT permitted. Use of any GPS device will result in disqualification. In each pairing if any player or coach uses a measuring device then all players in the pairing will have access to the information. Failure to share information, if requested, or providing false/inaccurate information constitutes a sportsmanship violation. First sportsmanship violation results in a warning, second sportsmanship violation results in a 2-stroke penalty and the third offense results in a disqualification.

1. USGA Rules will govern, except in cases of local ground rule change. The Tournament Committee will serve as final arbiter in all questions involving rules.
2. Contestants will keep each other's score within the foursome. The tournament official scorer will not accept scorecards unless they are signed by both the individual player and her scorer. Penalty for unsigned scorecards is automatic disqualification. Attesting areas will be provided along with a tournament official to conduct the attesting immediately after the completion of the final hole of the tournament. Participants must report to the attesting area after completion of each round, promptly and without delay. **After all scoring is complete, all necessary play-offs will be conducted.** Play-off holes will be announced at the day of the tournament. Players, coaches and spectators will need to abide by gallery rules and remain 25 yards away. Attending coaches will be expected to aid in crowd management. When possible, a representative of the golf course will accompany the play-off as a rules official. Otherwise, it will be two coaches and the acting tournament director. The coaches will not have any athletes in the play-off.
3. All putts must be holed out according to USGA Rules. Failure to do so will disqualify the player.
4. The following violations will result in disqualification:
 - smoking, use and or possession of tobacco products
 - use and / or possession of alcohol or any other controlled substance/ drug
 - abusive language – swearing
 - bettingAll players must report violations to the tournament director or a rules marshal at the first opportunity.
5. There shall be a two-stroke penalty for throwing a club. Should a second offense occur, the individual will automatically be disqualified from further play.

6. No caddies will be permitted. It is permissible for a player to pull her own cart. Players with a physical disability, which may require a cart, must, at the coaches meeting, provide a doctor's note requesting the cart. The tournament committee will review the situation and make a decision.
7. On the day of the tournament, practice is restricted to the putting green, chipping area and the practice range. There may be practice rounds, depending on availability. Must call course to set up time and players must pay fee.
8. One coach may give advice to members of his/her team. The coach shall be identified to "The Tournament Committee" before any team member begins play. Coaches may give advice to their players from the tee to the green and after a player has completed a hole and the player has left the putting green. Coaches may not go on to the green or in any hazards on the course. Coaches may not carry clubs or push player's carts. The coach must not cause a player to delay play.
9. Galleries are permitted; however, all spectators must keep at least 25 yards distance from the competitors and stay on the cart path. If there is no designated cart path then you must stay on side of fairways. You may not walk in fairways. Players who have completed their round are allowed to be part of the gallery but must follow the gallery restrictions.
10. All contestants and coaches must be clothed in proper golf attire, including: 1) shirts must have sleeves and collars and must be worn at all times. 2) Slacks or tailored shorts (mid-thigh or longer) only. 3) No jeans or jean material (denim) will be allowed. All clothing must be worn in a neat and respectable manner from the time the players arrive at the course until the time they leave. Violators of this dress code will be asked to leave the course and will be disqualified from the tournament. No electronic devices such as radios, cellular phones or head phones / ear buds are allowed.
11. Tournament managers will go over the rules and regulations of these guidelines with the coaches before the tournament. Coaches, in turn, will review these rules and regulations with their players before the tournament starts.

TYPE OF PLAY: All contestants will play 18 holes of stroke play. Players must report to the tee by their assigned tee time. The 5 minute rule will be strictly enforced.

PAIRINGS: To be made by the Tournament Director. Pairings shall be made up of contestants of equal ability as much as possible. If at all possible, players from the same school may not be in the same pairing and adjustments will be made as necessary.

COACHES: The golf coach or faculty representative must accompany all participating golfers to the tournament. The coach must check in and be prepared for mandatory coaches' meeting at 10:45am. All coaches are to remain at the golf course until their team or individuals have completed play.

CONCESSIONS: Food will be available at the course. Please keep the eating areas clean.

CLUBHOUSE AND PRO SHOP: Contestants should only be in the Pro Shop if making a purchase and not "hanging around" the clubhouse.

PRACTICE ROUNDS: There may be practice rounds, depending on availability. Call the club house (360) 683-6344 to arrange playing time.
